**Scripture** Hebrews 11.1-3, 13-16, 33a, 36a, 38-40, 12.1-2, 28-29 1 Faith is the reality of what we hope for, the proof of what we don't see. 2 The elders in the past were approved because they showed faith.

3 By faith we understand that the universe has been created by a word from God so that the visible came into existence from the invisible.

13 All these people died in faith without receiving the promises, but they saw the promises from a distance and welcomed them. They confessed that they were strangers and immigrants on earth. 14 People who say this kind of thing make it clear that they are looking for a homeland. 15 If they had been thinking about the country that they had left, they would have had the opportunity to return to it. 16 But at this point in time, they are longing for a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore, God isn't ashamed to be called their God—he has prepared a city for them. $\rightarrow$ 

33a Through faith they conquered kingdoms, brought about justice, realized promises, [and many other things.]36a But others experienced public shame by being taunted and whipped [and worse].

38 The world didn't deserve them. They wandered around in deserts, mountains, caves, and holes in the ground. 39 All these people didn't receive what was promised, though they were given approval for their faith. 40 God provided something better for us so they wouldn't be made perfect without us.

12.1 So then, with endurance, let's also run the race that is laid out in front of us, since we have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us. Let's throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, 2 and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter. He endured the cross, ignoring the shame, for the sake of the joy that was laid out in front of him, and sat down at the right side of God's throne.

28 Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that can't be shaken, let's continue to express our gratitude. With this gratitude, let's serve in a way that is pleasing to God with respect and awe, 29 because our God really is a consuming fire.
