Responsive Reading

A weaving of Psalm 119.33-41 and Romans 13.8-14

Leader: We read together, back and forth, words from Psalm 119 (piano side) and from Romans 13 (offering side).

Piano Side: Lord, teach me what your statutes are about, and I will guard every part of them.

Offering Side: Don't be in debt to anyone, except for the obligation to love each other. Whoever loves another person has fulfilled the Law.

Piano Side: Help me understand so I can guard your instruction and keep it with all my heart.

Offering Side: The commandments, Don't commit adultery, don't murder, don't steal, don't desire what others have, and any other commandments, are all summed up in one word: You must love your neighbor as yourself.

Piano Side: Lead me on the trail of your commandments because that is what I want. Turn my heart to your laws, not to greedy gain. \rightarrow

Offering Side: Love doesn't do anything wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is what fulfills the Law.

Piano Side: Turn my eyes away from looking at worthless things. Make me live by your way.

Offering Side: As you do all this, you know what time it is. The hour has already come for you to wake up from your sleep. Now our salvation is nearer than when we first had faith.

Piano Side: Confirm your promise to your servant the promise that is for all those who honor you.

Offering Side: The night is almost over, and the day is near. So let's get rid of the actions that belong to the darkness and put on the weapons of light.

Piano Side: Remove the insults that I dread because your rules are good.

Offering Side: Let's behave appropriately as people who live in the day, not in partying and getting drunk, not in sleeping around and obscene behavior, not in fighting and obsession. Instead, dress yourself with the Lord Jesus Christ, and don't plan to indulge your selfish desires.

Piano Side: Look how I desire your precepts! Make me live by your righteousness.

let your salvation come to me according to your promise-
