Responsive Reading from Hebrews 11.1-12.3, 1.1-3

Leader: Faith is the reality of what we hope for, the proof of what we don't see. The elders in the past were approved because they showed faith.

Piano Side: By faith we understand that the universe has been created by a word from God so that the visible came into existence from the invisible.

Offering Side: By faith Abel offered a better sacrifice to God than Cain, which showed that he was righteous, since God gave approval to him for his gift. Though he died, he's still speaking through faith.

Leader: Faith is the reality of what we hope for, the proof of what we don't see.

Piano Side: By faith Enoch was taken up so that he didn't see death, and he wasn't found because God took him up. He was given approval for having pleased God before he was taken up.

Offering Side: It's impossible to please God without faith because the one who draws near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards people who try to find him. \rightarrow

Leader: Faith is the reality of what we hope for, the proof of what we don't see.

Piano Side: By faith Noah responded with godly fear when he was warned about events he hadn't seen yet. He built an ark to deliver his household. With his faith, he criticized the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes from faith.

Offering Side: By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was going to receive as an inheritance. He went out without knowing where he was going.

Leader: Faith is the reality of what we hope for, the proof of what we don't see.

Piano Side: By faith Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses.

Offering Side: By faith Rahab.

Leader: And so many others. Through faith they conquered kingdoms, brought about justice, realized promises, shut the mouths of lions, put out raging fires, escaped from the edge of the sword, found strength in weakness.... by faith, so much has been endured.

Offering Side: So then, with endurance, let's also run the race that is laid out in front of us, since we have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us.

Piano Side: Let's throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter.

Leader: In these final days, God has spoken to us through Jesus, God's Son, who is the heir of everything.

Piano Side: God created the world through him.

Offering Side: Jesus, the Son, is the light of God's glory and the imprint of God's being.

All: Jesus endured the cross, ignoring the shame, for the sake of the joy that was laid out in front of him, and sat down at the right side of God's throne.

Scripture Hebrews 12.7, 11, 12-17

7 Bear hardship for the sake of discipline. God is treating you like sons and daughters! What child isn't disciplined by his or her father? 11 No discipline is fun while it lasts, but it seems painful at the time. Later, however, it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness for those who have been trained by it.

12 So strengthen your drooping hands and weak knees! 13 Make straight paths for your feet so that if any part is lame, it will be healed rather than injured more seriously. 14 Pursue the goal of peace along with everyone—and holiness as well, because no one will see the Lord without it. 15 Make sure that no one misses out on God's grace. Make sure that no root of bitterness grows up that might cause trouble and pollute many people. 16 Make sure that no one becomes sexually immoral or ungodly like Esau. He sold his inheritance as the oldest son for one meal. 17 You know that afterward, when he wanted to inherit the blessing, he was rejected because he couldn't find a way to change his heart and life, though he looked for it with tears.
