We welcome Eric Kurtz to our worship service and Sunday School hour this morning. He is executive director of Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) Great Lakes. MCC is a worldwide ministry of Anabaptist churches that shares God's love and compassion for all in the name of Christ. We work with local partners in 45 countries in relief, development, and peacebuilding. Eric lives in Goshen, Indiana, with his wife, Carmen Horst, and daughters Elisa and Nayli. His family attends Walnut Hill Mennonite Church, where Carmen is co-pastor. Before joining MCC, Eric used his environmental studies background with the Elkhart County Soil and Water Conservation District and with rural indigenous communities in Northern Argentina.

Monday Meals. We served 174 meals on October 9th. This coming Monday, October 16, we will serve a take-out baked potato bar.

Fall Sermon Series – HEBREWS. Our series takes a break this week for Peace Sunday. We will resume on October 22, with chapters 3 and 4. This New Testament letter/book/sermon was written most likely to a community of second-generation Jewish Christians in the Greek world. It appears they had lost some zeal and were struggling. In the opening two chapters, the author reminds them of who Jesus is -- God's way of speaking, exact image of God, he one who cleanses sin -- and who they and, by extension, we are – humans, like Jesus, brothers and sisters, co-heirs, redeemed by Jesus, and that Jesus' message is most definitely for them and they need to pay attention. Hebrews 2:18 provides the encouragement to continue – Jesus, is able to help those who are being tempted, since he himself experienced suffering when he was tempted.


