Lighting of the Lamps

Responsive Reading Selections from Hebrews

Leader: In the past, God spoke through the prophets to our ancestors in many times and many ways.

Scripture Hebrews 12.1b-2, 13.11-16

12.1b Let's throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, 2 and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter. He endured the cross, ignoring the shame, for the sake of the joy that was laid out in front of him, and sat down at the right side of God's throne.

11 The blood of the animals is carried into the holy of holies by the high priest as an offering for sin, and their bodies are burned outside the camp. 12 And so Jesus also suffered outside the city gate to make the people holy with his own blood.

13 So now, let's go to him outside the camp, bearing his shame.

14 We don't have a permanent city here, but rather we are looking for the city that is still to come.

15 So let's continually offer up a sacrifice of praise through him, which is the fruit from our lips that confess his name. 16 Don't forget to do good and to share what you have because God is pleased with these kinds of sacrifices.

Today, we finish our quick walk through the Book of Hebrews.

This all happens in Jesus, who is the way God speaks to us now, is the perfect representation of God, is God, is the everything. So, no more slacking. Get moving.
