January's Dollar Project will be directed to the Wooster Severe Weather Shelter. The shelter is headed by the 501c3 organization called Homeward Bound. The shelter is located in the gym of the Wooster Salvation Army Family Life Center and is open to community members from December 1 through March 31 when wind chill temperatures drop to 32 degrees or lower. The doors open at 6pm and overnight guests can stay until 8 am the following morning. They are provided with a cot and a meal. The meals are donated by local churches and volunteers assist from 6:00pm to 10:00pm. There are paid overnight staff. Pete and Lou Erb have volunteered for the past 2 years at the shelter. Donations are needed for the shelter rent as well as for necessary items like gloves, hats, hygiene kits, and socks. Since we will not be meeting in the church building until Sunday, January 14th please consider sending your donation into church.
