Scripture Ephesians 4:1-16 (NRSV)

I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: ⁴ there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

⁷ But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸ Therefore it is said,

"When he ascended on high, he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people."

⁹ (When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? ¹⁰ He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) ¹¹ He himself granted that some are apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. ¹⁴ We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming; ¹⁵ but speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, →

¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

January 2024 Worship and Fellowship Series. Along with Oak Grove, Crown Hill, and Wooster Mennonite Churches, we are in a sermon series called, *The Jesus Way*, looking at Anabaptist Faith

and Practice. Herald Press has a series of 10 books, focused around questions of faith and practice, called *The Jesus Way, Little Books of Radical Faith*. Last week, we took a look at the Trinity. The next sermon in the series will be **January 28** – *What is the Church and why does it exist?*

Coffee time! Coffee, tea and hot chocolate will be available upstairs in the church beginning at 9:00 am. There will be a place for coats in the overflow in addition to the row of hooks near the elevator and the coat rack near the library.

Monday Meals. This past Monday, January 15, Oak Grove Mennonite served 110 meals. This week, we will serve leftovers of cheeseburger and chicken noodle soups, and corndog casserole.

January's Dollar Project will be directed to the Wooster Severe Weather Shelter. The shelter is headed by the 501c3 organization

called Homeward Bound. The shelter is located in the gym of the Wooster Salvation Army Family Life Center and is open to community members from December 1 through March 31 when wind chill temperatures drop to 32 degrees or lower. The doors open at 6pm and overnight guests can stay until 8 am the following morning. They are provided with a cot and a meal. The meals are donated by local churches and volunteers assist from 6:00pm to 10:00pm. There are paid overnight staff. Pete and Lou Erb have volunteered for the past 2 years at the shelter. Donations are needed for the shelter rent as well as for necessary items like gloves, hats, hygiene kits, and socks.
