Responsive Reading 1 Corinthians 12.12-27

Leader: Christ is just like the human body—a body is a unit and has many parts; and all the parts of the body are one body, even though there are many.

All: We were all baptized by one Spirit into one body, whether Jew or Greek, or slave or free, and we all were given one Spirit to drink.

Leader: Certainly the body isn't one part but many. "If the foot says,

Piano Side: "I'm not part of the body because I'm not a hand," Leader: does that mean it's not part of the body? If the ear says, *Offering Side: "I'm not part of the body because I'm not an eye,"* Leader: does that mean it's not part of the body?

Piano Side: If the whole body were an eye, what would happen to the hearing?

Offering Side: And if the whole body were an ear, what would happen to the sense of smell? \rightarrow

Leader: But as it is, God has placed each one of the parts in the body just like he wanted. If all were one and the same body part, what would happen to the body?

All: ...There are many parts but one body.

Offering Side: So the eye can't say to the hand, "I don't need you," or in turn, the head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you." **Piano Side: Instead, the parts of the body that people think are**

the weakest are the most necessary.

Offering Side: The parts of the body that we think are less honorable are the ones we honor the most.

Piano Side: The private parts of our body that aren't presentable are the ones that are given the most dignity.

Leader: The parts of our body that are presentable don't need this.

All: But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the part with less honor

Leader: so that there won't be division in the body and so the parts might have mutual concern for each other.

All: If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part gets the glory, all the parts celebrate with it. 27 [We] are the body of Christ and parts of each other.

Scripture Acts 2.38-47

Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 This promise is for you, your children, and for all who are far away→ —as many as the Lord our God invites." 40 With many other words he testified to them and encouraged them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation." 41 Those who accepted Peter's message were baptized. God brought about three thousand people into the community on that day.

42 The believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers. 43 A sense of awe came over everyone. Worship and Fellowship Series – The Jesus Way

Along with Oak Grove, Crown Hill, and Wooster Mennonite Churches, we are in a sermon series called, *The Jesus Way*, looking at Anabaptist Faith and Practice. Herald Press has a series of 10 books, focused around questions of faith and practice, called *The Jesus Way, Little Books of Radical Faith*. Last week, we took a look at the Trinity.
