## Offering Song Longing for Light <br> SJ 54

Scripture Genesis 1.27-31, Revelation 21.9-12, 18, 21-27
${ }^{27}$ God created humanity in God's own image,
in the divine image God created them, male and female God created them.
${ }^{28}$ God blessed them and said to them, "Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and master it. Take charge of the fish of the sea, the birds in the sky, and everything crawling on the ground." ${ }^{29}$ Then God said, "I now give to you all the plants on the earth that yield seeds and all the trees whose fruit produces its seeds within it. These will be your food. ${ }^{30}$ To all wildlife, to all the birds in the sky, and to everything crawling on the ground-to everything that breathes - I give all the green grasses for food." And that's what happened. ${ }^{31}$ God saw everything he had made: it was supremely good.
${ }^{9}$ Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls full of the seven last plagues spoke with me. "Come," he said, "I will show you the bride, the Lamb's wife." ${ }^{10} \mathrm{He}$ took me in a Spiritinspired trance to a great, high mountain, and he showed me the holy city, Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God. ${ }^{11}$ The city had God's glory. Its brilliance was like a priceless jewel, like jasper that was as clear as crystal. ${ }^{12}$ It had a great high wall with twelve gates. $\rightarrow$
${ }^{18}$ The wall was built of jasper, and the city was pure gold, like pure glass. ${ }^{21}$ The twelve gates were twelve pearls; each one of the gates was made from a single pearl. And the city's main street was pure gold, as transparent as glass.
${ }^{22}$ I didn't see a temple in the city, because its temple is the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb. ${ }^{23}$ The city doesn't need the sun or the moon to shine on it, because God's glory is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. ${ }^{24}$ The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. ${ }^{25}$ Its gates will never be shut by day, and there will be no night there. ${ }^{26}$ They will bring the glory and honor of the nations into it. ${ }^{27}$ Nothing unclean will ever enter it, nor anyone who does what is vile and deceitful, but only those who are registered in the Lamb's scroll of life.

## Sermon Notes

March 17, 2024

Isaiah 2.1-5 Many nations will come to the Lord Swords made in plowshares
No one will learn war any more

Isaiah 9.1-11 A child to rule.
Endless peace, sustained with justice and righteousness
God's zeal will make this happen.

Isaiah 11.1-7 The wolf will live with the lamb. leopard and a young goat calf and young lion

## Shalom

A vision from the Bible of harmony, reflecting the situation in the Garden before the Fall, where people live in peace with God, with themselves, with each other, the earth, and the rest of creation. Martin Luther King, Jr. probably had this is mind as he talked about Beloved Community, a vision of a society where everyone has opportunity and everyone lives in peace.

## Two handed Non-Violence

From Barbara Deming, paraphrased in HyungJin Kim Sun in Who Are Our Enemies and How Do We Love Them? pp. 29-30 One hand held up toward the enemy, signaling them to stop, indicating that I will oppose you in every way I can except with violence The other hand reached out in love, saying I will not give upon you, that you are valuable.

## Reconciliation

Requires admission of wrongdoing and confession. Without this, it is violence, not peace. Trying to smooth something over, attempts at message control, and saying something like, "I'm sorry you took it that way" are tools of power, not reconciliation. And it may even require reparations.
