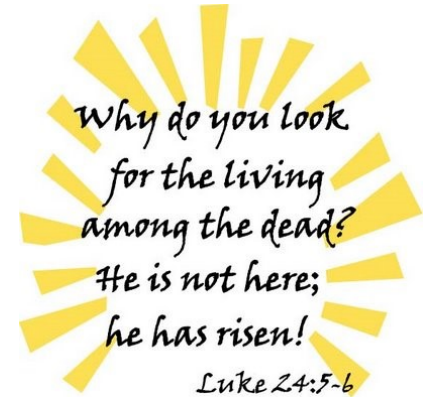
Congratulations on your graduation!
